## Principal's Summary (Attached)

## Liz Nowlan gave her report, attached with these minutes.

Learning from home has been challenging on everyone, with 17 days home out of 51 total, or $1 / 3$ of the term.
Difficulty holding students to account in striving for excellence.
A large percentage of students did not/could not complete their learning from home; some fell behind.
Many challenges to evaluations at this time; some children did not participate whatsoever during the period at home.
Liz's explanation will go out to parents regarding N/As, which will be in large number on report cards
Sufficient interaction/feedback with students was lacking.

- Formative report card this term; meant to be progress reports, versus summative report cards at year-end
- Extension for report cards was not granted - Minister denied the request from the Anglophone District
- Skills-driven curriculum more so than content-driven; skill development can continue all year for those who missed curriculum
- Grade 6 - outcome-driven (versus strand-driven in grades 7, 8); detailed reports in development/trial stages
*Some parents noted that the Grade 7 math report was much appreciated.

PT Interviews - will be with homeroom teacher, virtually; these teachers would have the strongest connection with the students/group - parents are still able to contact subject teachers directly at any time, but interview is with the homeroom teacher as liaison.
*Some parents would like to see a platform supporting meetings with subject teachers, quick meetings with all teachers - something more resembling the high school model; connecting with all teachers in short increments. Different options discussed.
